Court case discussion

- Court case status
- Appeal:
 - On Thursday, February 3, 2022 the Saik'uz and Stellat'en expressed their intent to appeal the January 7, 2022 court ruling
 - Appeal is in progress

TWG efforts related to the court case

- At the March 2, 2022 TWG meeting, reviewed the Reasons for Judgement including:
 - What is a finding?
 - The court's deliberation on flow regulation and habitat and fish populations (altered flows have had negative effects)
 - The court's find regarding white sturgeon (regulation has affected recruitment), chinook (population has rebounded to pre-dam levels), and sockeye (20C water temperature is inadequate)
 - The information the court referenced in its findings (generally not referenced)

TWG efforts related to the court case

- TWG was not surprised by the findings that flow regulation had affected fish and fish habitat
- However, the findings shouldn't really change what we are doing in the WEI
- We should continue our work based on best available information (including information before the courts where available), identify uncertainty, and make best decisions and recommendations we can

Southside Working Group

- Southside Working Group (SWG) met for the fourth time on January 11, 2022

- All recommendations will flow through the Main Table

Southside Working Group update

- Navigation channels and buoy/navigation aids. Exploring:
 - buoy designs
 - propose locations by SWG
 - ground truth locations
 - install buoys
 - monitor performance
- Docks. Exploring:
 - potential Wistaria Provincial Park upgrades (roles, discussions with park operators, design, procurement options)
 - Landing Road Dock near Wistaria (water depths, need for piles, 21
 materials, procurement)

Southside Working Group update (2)

- Other topics being investigated:
 - Mapping tools, both paper and digital
 - Submerged timber (scoping document to make sure the issue is captured correctly)
 - Survey equipment (map reservoir bottom)
